## Taking Action on the cost of living and providing more housing options for Tasmanians

### In the next 100 days we will:

- Extend existing electricity concessions to embedded network users, such as aged care homes.
- Commence the modernisation of Tasmania's residential tenancy laws to ensure they are fair, contemporary and responsive to tenants, landlords and the broader housing market.
- Introduce legislation to crack down on dodgy builders and prevent company phoenixing.
- Legislate improved protections for long-term caravan park residents.
- Commence Stage 2 of the transition toward longer-term funding arrangements for community sector organisations, including community and Agency consultation on an Outcomes Framework.
- Ensure all Neighbourhood Houses and their communities can have their say during Statewide consultation on the independent Neighbourhood Needs Analysis.
- Finalise consultation and input into the new Volunteering Action Plan.
- Release first-year outcomes from increased Government investment in the No Interest Loan Network, assisting low-income earners in Tasmania to access safe finance.
- Commence the community consultation process for the new permanent Huon Valley Child and Family Learning Centre outreach service.
- Deliver over 900,000 healthy school breakfasts to school students under the first term of new Statewide School Breakfast program in partnership with Variety Tasmania.
- Launch the "Get Involved" community campaign for the new Smithton Child and Family Learning Centre, providing free wrap-around support and services to families in this community.
- Commence the redevelopment of the Karinya Crisis Facility for young women in Launceston.
- Continue to deliver more social and affordable homes in the next 100 days, in line with our commitment to deliver 10,000 social and affordable homes by 2032.
- Kickstart the building of 100 new homes as a result of our Government tripling the First Home Owner grant to \$30,000.
- Introduce legislation to streamline necessary amendments to the Tasmanian Planning Scheme.
- Introduce the Housing Land Supply (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2026 to speed up the process for making new Housing Land Supply Orders.
- Release the second 13-lot parcel in the Huntingfield subdivision to increase the supply of housing in southern Tasmania.
- Submit the Development Application for Binalong Road, Mornington – delivering an additional 47 new social and affordable homes and refurbishing 12 existing homes.
- Submit the Development Applications for Stage 2 and 3 subdivisions of the Huntingfield land supply project.
- Submit the Government's application under the Housing Australia Future Fund Stage 3, to secure more than 500 additional social and affordable homes for Tasmania.
- Table the Housing Land Supply Order for 4.5 acres of land at Sulphur Creek on the North-West Coast.

- Undertake the legislated steps required under the Tasmanian Planning Scheme to increase the size of granny flats from 60m<sup>2</sup> to 90m<sup>2</sup> and increase housing supply.

## Building an even better health system

### In the next 100 days we will:

- Advertise the construction tender for the new \$120 million Northern Heart Centre.
- Announce successful providers to deliver the new 100% bulk-billed GP clinics.
- Announce successful recipients for the second round of the Government's Community Defibrillator fund, to provide more lifesaving devices across the State.
- Appoint members to the inaugural Older Tasmanians Ministerial Advisory Council.
- Begin training for Tasmania GPs to diagnose, treat and manage ADHD for both children and adults.
- Complete construction and officially open the new \$15 million Public Diagnostic Breast Imaging Centre at the RHH's Liverpool Street clinics.
- Finalise and release *The Health Revolution: 20-year Preventive Health Strategy*.
- Introduce legislation to strengthen penalties for selling illicit tobacco and vaping products.
- Invite tenders for the construction of the North-West Regional Hospital Mental Health Precinct.
- Open the new BreastScreen clinic in Devonport.
- Publish guidelines for the Government's new \$5 million IVF subsidy, beginning 1 July 2026.
- Release the construction tender for the Emergency Department expansion and ambulance drop-off upgrade at the North West Regional Hospital.
- Submit the Development Application for the expanded Emergency Department at the Launceston General Hospital.

## Delivering our Strong Plan for a Stronger Economy

### In the next 100 days we will:

- Commence Request for Tender for a lead contractor for the Macquarie Point Urban Renewal Project.
- Appoint contractors for site preparations ahead of the main contract and commence onsite works at the Macquarie Point Multipurpose Stadium.
- Introduce the new Short Stay levy Bill 2026, introducing a 5 per cent Short Stay Levy on 1 July 2026, in line with other States.
- Continue the delivery of reforms of Tasmania's liquor licensing laws, simplifying licensing and including 10-day timeframe for approval.
- Introduce legislation to deliver flexibility in land tax payment options, smoothing bill payments to assist with cost of living pressures, and reducing red tape
- Release legislation for second tranche reforms to modernise Government Business Enterprises.
- Contemporise the Department of Treasury and Finance Prequalification Scheme, to ensure it continues to meet the needs of industry.
- Deliver Single Form Tendering and a new Supplier Code of Conduct, to streamline procurement and contract documents.



- Provide agencies with the flexibility to include an economic and social benefits schedule of deliverables as part of the contract documentation under the Buy Local Policy, to ensure benefits are maximised for Tasmanians.
- Consult on legislation to implement Workplace Protection Orders to protect local businesses from criminal activity.
- Conduct roundtable with Regional Chambers of Commerce and a forum with peak bodies on the development of the Small Business Growth Strategy.
- Develop a pilot Single Start-Up Permit scheme based on feedback through Government consultation.
- As part of an industry-led trade mission, support Tasmanian businesses to attend Food & Hotel Asia Singapore to promote export growth, market diversification and deeper commercial ties across Southeast Asia.
- Deliver and launch Tasmania's first Antarctic Gateway prospectus to showcase priority opportunities and lift Tasmanian industry participation in Antarctic and Southern Ocean activities.
- Launch the Tasmanian Trade Strategy 2030 and Beyond.
- Partner with Wine Tasmania to host influential interstate wine trade representatives to ensure Tasmanian wine is on the wine lists and retail shelves in restaurants and shops across the country.
- Support Tasmanian industry participation at the Coop Supermarket Australia and the Direct2Store Expo in Sydney.
- Commence the refurbishment of the Poatina 2 turbine at Poatina Power Station, investing close to \$25 million into delivering increased energy reliability and security.
- Commence the feasibility study into a new Northern Tasmanian Building and Construction Training Centre.
- Announce Round 2 recipients of the Advanced Manufacturing Productivity Grant.
- Complete an Insights to Excellence Industry Tour for Tasmanian manufacturers to Brisbane, including attendance at the Australian Manufacturing Week Expo 2026.
- Develop an Investment Opportunity Guide to promote private projects seeking investment in the mining and minerals sector in Tasmania.
- Establish and progress the Government's EPBC bilateral negotiation plans to secure accreditation of Tasmania's forest management system and support positive outcomes for the forest industry.
- Lead a delegation to Canberra to seek solutions for delays in Federal approvals that are impacting on major Tasmanian resource projects.
- Release the draft Economic Diversification and Investment Strategy for consultation.
- Table an updated set of Mineral Resources Regulations that modernise the regulatory system and enable responsible growth across the Tasmanian mining sector.
- Award the first round of the Early Years workforce Development scholarships.
- Launch the next Industry Partnership Program to fund projects that improve training quality and responsiveness for Tasmanian learners and businesses.

- Open the \$7 million new TasTAFE Burnie Accommodation to support the needs of learners who need to travel to undertake their training.
- Open the Dairy Tas and Rural Youth of Tasmania multipurpose facility at Quercus Park.
- Open the modern and industry co-designed \$2.35 million TasTAFE Automotive Training Centre at Cambridge.
- Welcome the first placements of the Event Skills Program intake, of the Tasmanian Hospitality and Tourism Academy – providing practical, job-ready training designed to prepare students for real-world success in the state’s growing event and festival sector
- Support the successful return of the Supercar Championship to Symmons Plains Raceway as a key event in Tasmania’s major events calendar, backed by a Government commitment to support major events.
- Assess the economic benefits of the Aviation Attraction Fund to Tasmania’s visitor economy to inform government priorities.
- Launch the new Tourism Tasmania website providing the tourism industry with access to enhanced insights and tools to support their business.
- Launch *The Off Season* campaign to drive visitation through the winter months.
- Launch the Tasmanian Government Access Strategy to grow sustainable air and sea access supporting Tasmania’s future prosperity and community needs.
- Back in the 2026 ECHO Festival with government funding to 2027, celebrating the East Coast of Tasmania, its landscapes, history, people and produce
- Provide partnership funding towards the Destination Derby Community Master Plan.
- Release the 2030 Visitor Economy Action Plan Progress Report – July to December 2025.
- Support industry access to international visitor markets through participation at the Australian Tourism Exchange.
- Announce the outcomes of Round 3 of the Built Heritage Grants.
- Provide additional funding support for climate change innovation by business and industry sectors, through the Climate Change Business and Innovation Grants.
- Reform the use of the landfill levy to deliver broad and impactful outcomes supporting both industry and improved environmental and public health outcomes, including reforming the Waste and Resource Recovery Board.
- Release a Digital Inclusion Framework and set of targeted priorities for Government.
- Unlock new recycling, re-processing and resource recovery infrastructure across Tasmania through Round 3 of the High Priority Infrastructure Grants program.
- Announce list of initial school sites for Outside School Hours Care capital upgrades.
- Appoint an architectural consultant for the new Westbury Childcare Centre.
- Begin planning for Learning and Support Hubs to be piloted in two primary schools – a key measure in the Government’s *Violence in Schools-Keeping Staff Safe* action plan.
- Complete the overall \$23 million redevelopment of Hobart City High School.
- Complete the \$24.9 million redevelopment of Cosgrove High School.
- Consult on and introduce to Parliament a Teachers Registration Bill to deliver on the Commission of Inquiry recommendations and the Government’s commitment to register and better recognise Early Childhood Teachers.



- Finalise the grant agreement with the Huon Valley Council for the new Early Childhood Education and Care facility.
- Release the concept plan for the \$29 million redevelopment of Clarence City High School.
- Release the next Adult Literacy Strategy.
- Release the Numeracy Implementation Plan.
- Host a stakeholder roundtable for the next stage in the development of a new long-term Agriculture Strategy for Tasmania.
- Launch the opening of nominations for the 2026 Biosecurity Awards to recognise, reinforce and promote positive biosecurity actions.
- Progress actions to support the rapid rebuild of sand flathead stocks including the preparation for broodstock at IMAS for the stock enhancement program.
- Release the updated draft Horticultural Produce Regulations for consultation, delivering simpler requirements and reduced red tape
- Progress legislative and policy development for TasInsure, undertaking engagement with reinsurance markets and industry stakeholders, and advance design work for the TasInsure platform and associated insurance ecosystem reforms.
- Advertise and award the tender for the Huon Highway intersection safety upgrades at Grove.
- Advertise the tender for construction of Illawarra Road Stage 3 improvements.
- Begin construction of traffic signals at the Olinda Grove intersection at Mt Nelson.
- Complete the installation of the vehicle gantry at Berth 3 in Devonport.
- Participate in the Master Builders Tasmania – Building and construction – Tasmania First taskforce.
- Release the Devonport to Cradle Corridor Strategy for public consultation.
- Release the Ridgely Highway Corridor Strategy for public consultation.
- Start construction of Detention River Heavy Vehicle Driver Rest Area and complete the Westbury Eastbound Heavy Vehicle Driver Rest Area, both on Bass Highway.

## Supporting our Communities

### In the next 100 days we will:

- Announce significant new measures to strengthen family violence laws.
- Announce successful tenderer for the new Burnie Courts complex.
- Finalise the arrangements for the Government's nation-leading redress scheme for mothers impacted by historical forced adoptions.
- Commence work on a regional community sports facility infrastructure plan.
- Award the Tasman Arch contract, part of a \$1.65 million investment into Tasman Peninsula upgrades to walking tracks and platforms at the popular coastal site and allowing for greater all-abilities access.
- Commence work on the replacement of the Deal Island Lighthouse roof in Bass Strait, as part of the Parks and Wildlife boosted maintenance funding program.

- Release the Bay of Fires Masterplan, providing a 20-year vision for this beautiful and unique area of Tasmania.
- Award the contract to operate the Parks Online Booking System, to make it easier and simpler for Tasmanians and visitors to plan camping trips and Parks experiences.
- Award the contract and begin work on \$1.1 million upgrades to the Catamaran Campgrounds and boat ramp at Cockle Creek Campgrounds.
- Commence installation of the elite-level performance training court flooring system at the Tasmania JackJumpers and Tasmanian Jewels High Performance Training Facility.
- Officially open the doors of the new Northern Suburbs Recreation Hub, establishing it as the State's largest indoor multi-sport and recreation centre.
- Progress construction of the Glenorchy Sports Centre, including foundational and structural works to support this new build of more community sports courts.
- Publicly release the planning application to support the Stage 3 expansion of the Northern Recreational Hub.
- Debate Daniel's Law – legislation to protect children and empower parents and carers.
- Release the transition plan for the phase-out of greyhound racing in Tasmania.
- Encourage and celebrate diversity across the State with the announcement of recipients of the Multicultural Community Festival Grants Program 2025-26.
- Support the conservation and protection of Tasmania's native flora and fauna, through delivery of \$600,000 of funding to recipients under Round 2 of the Threatened Species Partnership Grants Program.
- Announce the inaugural membership of the Disability Inclusion Advisory Committee.
- Consult with key stakeholders on the Youth Justice Act review Discussion Paper – a key recommendation of the Commission of Inquiry.
- Announce the recipients of the 2026 Cameron Baird VC MG scholarships.
- Deliver additional funding to support landowners to protect and improve nature on their properties through action on landcare, including weed control and invasive species management.
- Release discussion paper for public consultation on the trial of the commercial use of wild shot fallow deer.
- Release the Government's response to the public consultation on the wild fallow deer management plan policy review.
- Begin the use of Farm Assist to increase recreational hunter access to private land to control deer.
- Finalise initial areas of public land to be opened for hunting to control deer.
- Release the Government's response to the independent Woolcott review into the Government's actions taken in response to the Commission of Inquiry.
- Release the new Tasmanian Disaster Resilience Strategy – a roadmap for building resilience against natural and other disasters.
- Hold the inaugural Minister's Local Government Forum meeting.
- Introduce new Sunday bus services for Brighton.
